NADAB & ABIHU Leviticus 10

Holiness is the fundamental descriptor of who God is. It is not merely <u>one</u> of His many attributes; it is the <u>key</u> to His very being.

God's holiness is something to be revered.

Holiness: The doctrine that God is <u>separated</u> from sin and devoted to <u>seeking</u> His own honor—Wayne Grudem.

When we make <u>worship</u> about our likes and our dislikes we <u>cheapen</u> the holiness of God.

Worship was <u>created</u> by God and for God. Worship is all about <u>making</u> the most of <u>Jesus</u>, <u>uplifting</u> His holiness.

God will not allow His holiness to be violated.

Worship is all about making the most of Jesus, uplifting His holiness.

God's holiness is not a joke - it is very real.

God's holiness is not <u>defined</u> by a worship service <u>style</u>.

God's holiness is what sets Him <u>apart</u> and allows for us, Christ-followers, to be <u>set apart</u>.

God's holiness is about making the most of Jesus, every day and in every way - in our <u>thoughts</u>, <u>decisions</u> and <u>actions</u>.

5. How do we know if we are living the life that we are called to by God? Read Galatians 5:22. What is the fruit in your own life currently?
