Philippians 2

How to go deeper in community...

1. Pursue genuine unity instead of surface friendships. (vs. 1-2)

Make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and purpose.

2. Put others before yourself (vs. 3-4)

Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others.

3. Follow Jesus' example of <u>humility</u> (vs. 5-11)

Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus...

Theological Aside: Christiology

- Jesus Christ is God Eternal
- Jesus Christ is <u>Fully God</u>
- Jesus Christ is <u>Perfect Man</u>
- Jesus Christ was the <u>Perfect Sacrifice</u> for sin

4. Access <u>God's power</u> when you are tempted to <u>grumble</u> and <u>argue</u> with others. (vs. 12-18)

Do everything without complaining or arguing so that you may become blameless and pure...

Two examples of humble, courageous men:

- <u>Timothy</u> (vs. 19-24)
- Epaphroditus (vs. 25-30)

- For the sake of love and unity, I will initiate a healing conversation with someone with whom I have had a conflict this week.
- This week I will pray that God gives me the power to quit complaining and arguing with others.
- o I am committing to follow Jesus for the first time today.
- o I am re-committing to follow Jesus today.

3. Why does Paul say to "work out your salvation with fear and trembling" in verse 12?

4. Referring back to Sunday's message, why are Timothy and Epaphroditus used as examples of people who display humility?

5. How might this section of Scripture translate into our everyday life in regards to our children, spouses, co-workers, etc.? What are some examples of what putting others first in these areas would look like?

6. **Read Proverbs 22:4.** What is Solomon (the author of this proverb) talking about when he refers to the reward of "humility and fear of the Lord" being "wealth, honor and life"?
