Key Idea in Acts 5

Making a supernatural mark is natural with the power of the Holy Spirit.

Acts 5:1-11

Compromise and deception prevent us from making a supernatural mark.

- ❑ NEXT STEP: This week I will surrender to the Holy Spirit what I've kept back for myself.

Acts 5:12-16

Making a supernatural mark is natural with the power of the Holy Spirit.

Acts 5:17-42

Making a supernatural mark will transform a natural life.

- ❑ NEXT STEP: This week I will take hold of natural circumstances as supernatural opportunities.

Making a supernatural mark often brings a supernatural reward.

Making a supernatural mark requires supernatural obedience.

- ❑ NEXT STEP: This week I will live with supernatural obedience: teaching people, intentional presence, speaking God's truth, rejoicing and persevering.

Natural marks fail. Supernatural marks are unstoppable.

- When is a time past or present that you have tried to “fool God”? What happened?

- Pastor Jeff taught us that the “Supernatural” is now the “New Natural” with the power of the Holy Spirit. What does this mean to you? How would you apply it to your life?

➤ How do you explain why sometimes God delivers you out of hardships, but other times He allows you to go through them?

➤ **Read Acts 5:17-20.** In what way has God set you free to help you make your mark for Jesus?
