Living Beyond Ourselves *Ephesians 5:15-21*

1. Live <u>WISELY</u> (vs. 15-17)

Be very careful then, how you live, not as unwise, but as wise... (v. 15)

- Pay close <u>ATTENTION</u> (v. 15)
- Grab <u>OPPORTUNITIES</u> (v. 16)
- Reject <u>FOOLISHNESS</u> (v. 17)

Principle: <u>SELF-CENTERED</u> Christians make <u>MISERABLE</u> Christians.

<u>SELF-FOCUSED</u> churches make <u>MISERABLE</u> churches.

2. Be <u>FILLED</u> with the Spirit (vs. 18-21)

Do not get drunk on wine... but be filled with the Spirit (v. 18)

To be filled with the Spirit means to be under His <u>CONTROL</u> and influence.

Exercise: "Spiritual BREATHING"

Breathe Out:

Confess SIN and give CONTROL

Breathe In:

Ask the Spirit to FILL, EMPOWER and LEAD

Spirit-filled Christians choose to:

- Express <u>PRAISE</u> for God (v. 19)
- Give <u>THANKS</u> to God (vs. 19-20)
- Submit to <u>ONE ANOTHER</u> because of Jesus (v. 21)

Principle: Submitting to one another leads to <u>SERVING</u> others, giving <u>GENEROUSLY</u>, and sharing our <u>FAITH</u>, rather than focusing on what we want out of church.

Lesson Aim: To look beyond ourselves & serve others.

Icebreaker: What are some ways that children imitate others as they grow up?

- 1. In the message this weekend, Chris said that "Self-centered Christians make miserable Christians. Self-focused churches make miserable churches." How have you seen and/or experienced this to be true?
- 2. How have you seen and/or experienced the opposite of this statement to be true as well?
- 3. **Read Ephesians 5:1-14.** Verse 2 tells us that Christ is the perfect example of living a life of love that imitates God. How does it help us to know that Christ has gone before us in living this life of love?
- 4. What behaviors does Paul condemn (verses 3-4)?

- 5. Paul contrasts light and darkness to discuss holy living in verses 8-14. Share a practical example of what it means to live as "children of light".
- 6. What are some ways we go through processes of change to be able to live more like "children of light"? Please share personal examples if able.
- 7. **Read Ephesians 5:15-21.** What characterizes wise people according to verses 15-17?
- 8. As we consider our own lives, how then can we live more wisely?
- 9. Using your own words, discuss the characteristics of those who are filled with the Holy Spirit (verses 18-20).
- 10. As you consider you life, in what areas do you most need to be filled with the Holy Spirit?

Memorizing Scripture is a key tool to resist temptation, make wise decisions, strengthen us under stress, comfort us when we're sad and to witness to those who don't know Christ.
