



WHOLEHEARTED WORSHIP

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Malachi 1:6-14

Wholehearted worship is constantly acknowledging who God is by the way I live for Him. v.6

- ♦ Wholehearted worship is demonstrated by honoring God as Our Father.

Romans 8:15-16

- ♦ Wholehearted worship is demonstrated by respecting God as Our Master.

Romans 14:11

- ♦ Wholehearted worship shows no contempt towards God's holy name.

Wholehearted worship is not what we think it is but what God says it is. (vs. 7-9)

- ♦ God wants us to give Him our very best.
- ♦ We need to sacrificially offer ourselves completely to Him.

Romans 12:1-2

- ♦ We need to continuously worship Him.

Hebrews 13:15-16

Wholehearted worship is lived out by doing what pleases God Our Almighty King. (vs. 10-14)

- ♦ Will I live to please Him or will I still live to please myself?
- ♦ Do people see in me that the name of Jesus is great?
- ♦ Do I live out my walk with Jesus as a burden?
- ♦ Do I cheat God of giving Him my very best?

Lesson Aim: We need to express whole-hearted worship by becoming a living sacrifice “24/7”.

Prayer: Ask the Holy Spirit to lead your time together.

Icebreaker: Do you tend to see the glass as half empty or half full?

1. **Read Malachi 1:6-14.** Who is the target of the Lord’s probing questions in verses 6-8? What is wrong with their gift-giving?
2. Why do you think these people are just “going through the motions”?
3. Have you been (or are you) at a place where you were just “going through the motions” in your relationship with God?
4. How does this chapter affirm the greatness of the Lord?

5. How has the Lord shown His greatness to you?

6. **Read Romans 12:1-2.** How can you offer your “body” as a living sacrifice to the Lord?

7. What do these words add to your understanding of true worship?

8. In what ways do you tend to conform to the world?

9. How does the “renewing of the mind” happen?

Close in prayer as God leads you.

Memorizing Scripture is a key tool to resist temptation, make wise decisions, strengthen us under stress, comfort us when we’re sad and to witness to those who don’t know Christ.
