Prayer: Start your time together by asking the Holy Spirit to lead your discussion or devotional time.



- 1. Read Colossians 4:2-6. In advancing the Gospel message, what role is played by prayer? By being watchful? By being thankful?
- 2. How have you seen or experienced God using either prayer, being watchful or thankful to help advance the Gospel message?
- 3. From verses 5-6, what principles do you want to build into your prayer life as you relate to people who don't know Jesus?
- 4. In what settings are you around people who don't know Jesus?
- 5. What opportunities has God given you lately to have a conversation with someone who doesn't know Jesus or about the Gospel?
- 6. What fears do you have about sharing Christ with others? What joys do you find in sharing Christ with others?
- 7. In speaking about our duty of lifestyle evangelism, Pastor Scott talked about being "salty." What does that mean to you?
- 8. Read 1 Peter 3:15-16. What hope does Christ's life, death and resurrection provide? How can you personalize this hope so that you can share it with others?
- 9. What might be some ways we can follow Peter's model for evangelism?

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INTRODUCTION

PRINCIPLE #1: The Christian life is one of surrender & active collaboration with God.

- ▶ The two hardest behaviors for Christians to integrate into their daily lives are:
- Externally-focused <u>prayer</u>
- 2 Lifestyle evangelism

THE DUTY OF EXTERNALLY-FOCUSED PRAYER (Colossians 4:2-4)

▶ Prayer springs from <u>faith</u>... it is a Christian <u>duty</u>... it is <u>work</u>... it requires <u>persistence</u> & <u>attentiveness</u>... it includes <u>gratitude</u>... it <u>opens doors</u>... it brings <u>vitality</u>, <u>boldness</u> & <u>clarity</u>

PRINCIPLE #2: Thankfulness tends to chase a grumpy complaining spirit away.

THE DUTY OF LIFESTYLE EVANGELISM (Colossians 4:5-6)

► "Evangelism" = getting good news out

A. Be wise

PRINCIPLE #3: There is no impact without contact.

PRINCIPLE #4: When a good message is proclaimed in a bad way it can do more harm than good.

B. Be bold

PRINCIPLE #5: Being bold means you not only take opportunities, but also make opportunities.

- C. Be salty (cf. Matthew 5:13)
- ➤ We humbly disarm hostility, awaken people from spiritual apathy & win people to faith in Christ by both WHAT we say & HOW we say it
