- 1. READ Colossians 4:7-18. Take a minute to review the thematic descriptions of all the people mentioned in Paul's final greetings to the Colossian believers. Which person (or people) on this list do you most identify with and why?
- 2. The whole point of Pastor Scott's message was that God can use all kinds of different people to do His kingdom work and that God can use anybody. Do you ever struggle with feeling like God can't use you in ministry? Why or why not?
- 3. Verses 10-14 describe six of Paul's ministry companions. Do you have a group of people like this that you regularly do ministry with? If not, how can you start to move towards that?
- 4. What is one selfless act of service that you can do this week?



- 5. What is one selfless act of service that you can do with members of your LifeGroup this week? (Consider how your LifeGroup members are gifted, skilled, and called.)
- 6. Reread Paul's final, handwritten greeting in verse 18. Try to imagine the Colossian believers as they crowded around the letter's reader to see for themselves the loving signature of the great apostle. What do you think this letter and final salute meant to them?

PRINCIPLE #1: There is greatness in the smallest things done for Christ.

PRINCIPLE #2: There are no <u>impossible cases</u> with God. You too can be a <u>turn-around</u> story!
