Prayer: Start your time together by asking the Holy Spirit to lead your discussion.

Icebreaker: If told that you were going to be responsible for a newborn baby this year, how would you react?

- 1. This week's teaching was about two people who each received a surprise message from God. What is a recent surprise that you or your family have/has experienced?
- 2. **READ Luke 1:5-10.** What stands out to you about Zechariah and Elizabeth? What feelings might the couple have had in light of being unable to have children for so many years?
- 3. **READ Luke 1:11-25.** Describe this child's mission in your own words. Why would Zechariah have his doubts?
- 4. Doubt is something that can affect all of us at one time or another. The following Bible verses describe instances in which people showed their doubts: Mark 9:17-24; Luke 7:18-23; John 20:24-29. READ each section one at a time and answer this question: What do you learn about doubt and/or Jesus' response to it from these stories?
- 5. Have you ever felt like doubt or unbelief have been a hindrance to your faith? When? How?
- 6. Do you think doubt or unbelief can ever help you grow spiritually? If so, how?
- 7. **READ Luke 1:26-38.** How does Mary respond differently than Zechariah?
- 8. How would this change Mary's life? What reasons would she have to fear these changes?
- 9. When was a time you were believing but fearful in response to something God was doing in your life? How did God meet with you?
- 10. In what area of your life right now do you need to believe that nothing is impossible with God? What keeps you from believing this?
