Looking Back – Looking Forward

Lesson Aim: Celebrating what God has done and looking forward to where He still wants us to step out in faith.

Bridge LifeGroups are **currently on winter break**. We will continue to offer study questions each week in this simplified format, which can be useful for personal devotions and/or discussion starters for LifeGroups that choose to meet for a portion of the winter break.

Prayer: Start your time together by asking the Holy Spirit to lead your discussion.

Icebreaker: Have you ever been involved in a project or organization that lacked vision? What was that experience like?

- 1. **Read Joshua 3:1-17.** While waiting to cross the Jordan, what do you think the people were feeling? Praying? Anticipating?
- 2. What are some ways you can personally "consecrate yourself" (verse 5) to get ready for the "amazing things" God wants to do in your life?
- 3. **READ Joshua 4:1-9.** Why did Joshua have the people set up a monument?
- 4. Looking back on 2012, what are one or more "monuments" you are excited about and want to remember that happened through The Bridge? Why?
- 5. Looking back on your own personal life, what are one or more "monuments" that you want to remember from 2012? Why?
- 6. Israel crossed the Jordan "on dry ground", but was also armed for battle. This reminded them that God delivers but also that there were big battles ahead. Looking ahead to 2013, do you have room for God to do some new things in your life in the areas of connecting, growing, serving or reaching? How? What will be the challenges to this that you will have to battle against?
- 7. As God was with the Israelites when they moved forward in battle, so He is with us as we move forward in the things He calls us to. What are some specific plans you can make to ensure you will be consistent in moving forward and following Him?

Close in prayer by asking God for His vision for yourself, family, friends and The Bridge and however else the Lord leads you.
