Luke 2:1-20

WHY TELL THE SHEPHERDS AT BETHLEHEM FIRST? (Luke 2:1-8)

- The image of the Shepherd points to <u>God</u> (Psalm 23:1-4; Isaiah 40:11; John 10:14-15)
 - ► Shepherds <u>live sacrificially</u> to offer their sheep provision, care, guidance, protection, restoration & discipline
 - ► Sheep are <u>dirty</u>, not particularly <u>bright</u>, <u>fearful</u>, easily <u>distracted</u>, quick to <u>wander</u> & <u>defenseless</u> (Isaiah 53:6)
- 2 Israel's Patriarchs were all Shepherds (Genesis 47:3)
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- David was called from the sheep pen to shepherd Israel (Psalm 78:70-72)
- **6** The OT predicts the Messiah was to be born in Bethlehem (Micah 5:2)

BIG IDEA: Themes like shepherding & Bethlehem clearly point to the glory days of Israel's past

PRINCIPLE: God is for the underdog!

SHEPHERDS IN THE DAY OF CHRIST

- Poor & downtrodden
- ❷ Filthy & "disqualified"
- **1** Despised class of people

THE SHEPHERDS' RESPONSE (Luke 2:9, 15-18, 20)

- Terrified (v.9b)
- 2 Listened (v.15)
- Believed (v.15)
- Acted quickly (v.15)
- **5** Found Christ (v.16)
- **6** Spread the word (v.17)
- Glorified & Praised God (v.20)

- o I will read and meditate on Psalm 23 this week.
- I fully accept my role as one of God's sheep & need Christ to shepherd me.
- o I'm becoming a follower of Jesus today!

- 2. **READ Luke 2:1-20.** Of all the people the angels could have visited, why do you suppose God sent them to shepherds?
- 3. How does this relate to Mary's Song (**READ Luke 1:46-55**)?
- 4. What three titles are given to Jesus in verse 11? What is significant about them?
- 5. God appeared to the shepherds when they were just "being themselves" at work. Have you ever felt like God has forgotten you at your place of work or in everyday life?
- 6. How has God spoken to you or revealed Himself to you in the ordinary flow of life?
- 7. What are some ways we can worship Jesus in everyday life this Christmas season?

Close in prayer as the Holy Spirit leads you.
