INTRODUCTION

- God has set eternity in the human heart; yet no one can fathom what God has done from beginning to end. (Ecclesiastes 3:11b)
- Dilemma: We are designed to live forever but currently we're experiencing death

HELL

- It really <u>exists</u>
 - Hell was originally created for the devil and his fallen angels (Matthew 25:41)
 - W.G.T. Shedd Eternal perdition is like any other danger. In order to escape danger, one must believe it. Disbelief of it is sure destruction.
- ❷ God is <u>not there</u> (2 Thessalonians 1:8-9; cf. Isaiah 59:2))
- It is a place of <u>endless suffering</u>
 - ► Hell is a place (or state) of future, <u>conscious punishment</u> for the <u>wicked</u>
 - Eternal separation from (the presence of) God
 - Constant, endless torment and suffering of both body & spirit
 - ► Jesus' metaphors used for describing Hell
 - Gehenna Weeping Gnashing of teeth (Matthew 8:12; 13:42, 50; 22:13; 24:51; 25:30; Luke 13:28)
 - Everlasting fire (Matthew 25:41), everlasting punishment (Matthew 25:46), eternal damnation, (Mark 6:29), fiery furnace (Matthew 13:42), unquenchable fire (Mark 9:48), where the worm never dies (Mark 9:48)

- ► Other NT metaphors used for describing Hell
- Everlasting destruction (2 Thessalonians 1:9), blackest darkness... forever (Jude 13), everlasting chains (Jude 6), the Lake of Fire (Revelation 20:6,10,14-15), the Second Death (Revelation 20:14)
- Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather, be afraid of the One who can destroy both soul and body in hell. (Matthew 10:28)
- **OBJECTION:** How could a loving God ever send someone to a place of eternal suffering? Isn't that inconsistent with His character?
- Will not the Judge of all the earth do right? (Genesis 18:25)
- People send themselves there
- **QUESTION:** What about the people who die without ever hearing the Gospel of Jesus Christ? Do they go to Hell?
- Faulty thinking behind this question
- We are all pretty good people who deserve to go to heaven (Romans 3:23; 6:23)
- What about the "noble savage"? (Romans 2:15; 3:10)
- Doesn't ignorance absolve us from the guilt of breaking the law? (Romans 2:12)
- Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to men by which we must be saved. (Acts 4:12)

THE TRUTH ABOUT HELL SHOULD...

- Make every undecided (unsaved) person tremble (Luke 13:3,5)
- Make every professing Christian diligently do <u>self-examination</u> (cf. Matt. 7:22- 23)
- Lead the truly redeemed to <u>explode</u> in <u>praise</u> to <u>God</u>
- Stir up our urgent responsibility to share Christ with others
