RECAP OF GROUND COVERED THIS MONTH

- \boxdot We are all hard-wired to live forever
- \boxdot Sin separates us by nature from our God & leads to death

- God is <u>there</u> (Habakkuk 2:14; Job 19:25-27; Revelation 21:3; 22:4-5)
- <u>All things</u> will be made <u>new</u>
 (Revelation 21:1,5; 1 John 3:2; Isaiah 65:17)
- There will be <u>no more curse</u> (Revelation 21:4; 22:3)

HOW TO GET IN WITH HONORS & REWARDS

- How to get in... (Revelation 20:15; John 3:16)
- How to get in with honors & rewards
- Question: If people are saved by simply believing in Christ, why bother with all the effort, obedience & sacrifice if we all end up getting the same thing anyway?

Answer:

- "Living it up in sin" is really death in slow motion
- Restated: Instead of being the <u>best</u> person in <u>Hell</u>, how can I be the worst person in <u>Heaven</u>?
- Don't forget about <u>rewards</u> in <u>Heaven</u>
 (1 Corinthians 3:10-15; 2 Corinthians 5:10; 1 Timothy 6:17-19)

- $\circ~~$ I will read Revelation 21 22 this week.
- \circ $\,$ I'm asking Jesus to be my Lord and Savior for the first time today.
- $\circ \quad I \ am \ recommitting \ my \ life \ to \ Jesus \ today.$

Lesson Aim: To grow in our understanding of the reality of Heaven and living with an eternal perspective today.

Prayer: Ask the Holy Spirit to lead your study time and/or discussion.

Ice-breaker: How have you pictured Heaven in the past?

- 1. Review your notes from last weekend's message. What about Heaven are you looking forward to the most? Why?
- 2. A key point about Heaven from Pastor Scott's message was that "all things will be made new." This includes being given a new, heavenly body. **READ 1 Corinthians 15:50-58**. What are some things about the "perishable, mortal" bodies we live in today that frustrate you?
- 3. Use your imagination for a moment. What might it be like to have an "imperishable, immortal" body?
- Verse 57 tells us that Jesus "gives us victory over sin and death." **READ Colossians 2:11-15 & Ephesians 2:1-10**. According to these verses, how did Jesus defeat sin and death?

- 5. How can this hope motivate us to "give ourselves fully to the work of the Lord" (cf. 1 Corinthians 15:58)? What might this look like for you in your daily living? Be as specific as you can.
- 6. **READ the following verses of Scripture.** What do they teach us about eternal rewards given by God based on how we live our lives today?
 - 1 Corinthians 3:10-15:
 - 2 Corinthians 5:1-10:
 - Colossians 3:22-25:
- 7. **READ 1 Timothy 6:6-20.** What are the advantages & disadvantages of being rich? Think about this from a spiritual, eternal perspective.
- 8. Have you ever been the recipient of someone who has been generous with their wealth and/or good deeds? Please share one example and how it made you feel.
- 9. What opportunities do you have to be generous with your wealth and/or good deeds this week?

Close in prayer as the Holy Spirit leads you.
