## **CROSS TALK**

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**Lesson Aim:** To discuss the final words of Jesus on the Cross and their implications in knowing and following Him for us today.

**Prayer:** Ask the Holy Spirit to lead your study time and/or discussion.

**Ice-breaker:** Have you seen any of the "faith-based" movies in theaters recently? Which ones and what did you think of them?

- 1. **READ Isaiah 53:12 & Luke 22:32-34.** Jesus shows us the amazing depth of His love as He actually prays for those who crucified Him. When we think about our own "enemies" (or people we just don't get along with or who irritate us) why is the idea of praying for them so difficult?
- 2. What can we do to follow Jesus' example of praying for our "enemies"? What are some specific things you can pray for these people?
- 3. Though the Romans physically laid hands on Jesus to crucify Him, what responsibility do we bear for Jesus' death on the cross?
- 4. **READ Luke 22:35-43.** Why do you think one of the criminals insulted and mocked Jesus? Why do you think the other criminal rebuked his fellow thief? What did the criminal who turned to Jesus for mercy have to believe about Him?

- 5. When did you first realize you were like the second thief (guilty of sin and in need of Christ's forgiveness)? If you're not sure you agree with this, what doubts do you have?
- 6. **READ John 19:25-27**. What are the implications of Jesus' Third Word for our own personal family relationships?
- 7. **READ Psalm 22:1-18 & Mark 15:33-36.** In what sense was Jesus forsaken? Why was this necessary? How does this Fourth Word reveal God's love?
- 8. **READ John 19:28-29.** Why do you think the New Testament makes such a strong point about Jesus' physical suffering? What difference would it make if Jesus were only a divine person who didn't suffer on the cross?
- 9. **READ John 19:30**. Why did Jesus shout out the Sixth Word rather than say it quietly? What did He come to accomplish... to "finish"?
- 10. **READ Luke 23:43-49**. Why do you think Christ's final words here were so powerful to the centurion and others who heard Him? How can this bring comfort and faith to our lives when we feel anxiety or depression setting in?

Close in prayer as the Holy Spirit leads you.
