Luke 12:13-21

A man comes to Jesus to solve a <u>family conflict</u> (vs. 13-14) Jesus turns the request into a lesson how to handle our <u>money</u> and <u>possessions</u>.

How to handle our possessions:

1. Guard yourself against <u>materialism</u>. (vs. 15)

Unless we actively protect ourselves we will become materialistic.

Why?

- Materialism tells us that our possessions make us important.
- Materialism tells us possessions will make us secure.
- Materialism tells us more/newer possessions will make us <u>happy</u>.
- 2. Realize that your possessions are <u>not</u> all about <u>you</u>. (vs. 16-19)

We are simply <u>stewards</u> of what God has given to us to use for His purposes.

3. Look for <u>opportunities</u> to be <u>generous</u> with your money and possessions now. (vs. 20)

The cure for materialism is sacrificial giving.

- Return the First 10% back to God.
- Give to other <u>needs</u> and <u>causes</u> as God directs.
- 4. Live with <u>less</u> so you can invest in <u>eternal priorities.</u> (vs. 21)
 - Your relationship with <u>God</u>, <u>family</u> and <u>friends</u>.
 - Service to God and others.
 - Helping others <u>find</u> and <u>follow</u> Jesus.

- \circ I am committing to follow Jesus for the first time today.
- I will to buy a brand new hardcover book for Ernie Pyle Elementary. (drop off at Connection Center next Sunday)
- o This week I will help a friend with a financial need.
- I am committing to give the first 10% to the work of God.

4. What might cause a person to deny Jesus before others (verse 9)?

5. Who are the rulers and authorities in your daily life? Describe a situation you are in right now in which you must acknowledge Jesus before others. How might you handle it?

Close in prayer as the Holy Spirit leads you.
