Multi-Generational Discipleship

2 places for spiritual multi-generational influence:

- <u>Home</u> (Ephesians 6:4; Mark 10:13-16)
- Church (Hebrews 10:24-25; Deuteronomy 6:5-7)
 - Time and Consistency leads to Influence
 - > Influence produces <u>Impact</u>
 - ➤ Impact promotes <u>World-View</u> (Biblical)
 - ➤ World-View generates <u>World-Changers</u>

What happens spiritually when Generations serve one another?

- They live on Mission (Matthew 28:18-20)
- They Develop Generations of World Changers

First Commandment	Great Commission
Genesis 1:28	Matthew 28:18-20
Be fruitful & multiply	Make disciples
Fill the earth	Of all nations
Subdue it	Teach them to observe

- Marriage, the <u>family</u>, and raising godly <u>children</u> are connected to fulfilling the Great Commission.
- ➤ Treating one other graciously across generations will speak positively and powerfully to our world as we fulfill the Great Commission. (1 Timothy 5:1-2)
- They understand biblically that every person can make a difference for the "Next Generation" (Matthew 18: 10-14; Psalm 145:4)

Application

- Take the discipleship of the next generation seriously and embrace your call to serve one another.

4. Read Matthew 18:10-14. As Jesus was teaching his disciples, He asked a child to stand next to him while He was teaching about the 100 sheep. Why do you think such a strong emphasis is put on saving the children?

5. What can you as an individual, or a group, do to embrace the call of discipleship to the next generation?
